



## Ark Byron Primary Academy: Sports Grant 2016-2017

The primary PE and sport premium is paid by the Secretary of State for Education to academies and free schools as stated in section 14 of the Education Act 2002. The purpose of the premium is to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage healthy and active lifestyles.

The amount due to Ark Byron is £8,300. The grant is payable on the basis of the numbers of pupils in Years 1 to 6. This year (2016-17) is the first year that the grant has been received by Ark Byron. Payments are made in January and May.
