Religious Education

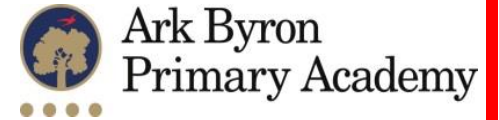
Different Indian festivals and what Hindus believe.
