PE and Sport Premium Impact Report 2022 - 23

1. Key indicators

At Ark Byron Primary Academy we expect to see improvements in the following five key areas as a result of PE and Sport Premium spending:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – The Chief Medical Officer Guidelines recommend that all children and young people age 5 – 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be at school.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, skills and knowledge of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
